AUGUST HOROSCOPES & BIRTHDAYS

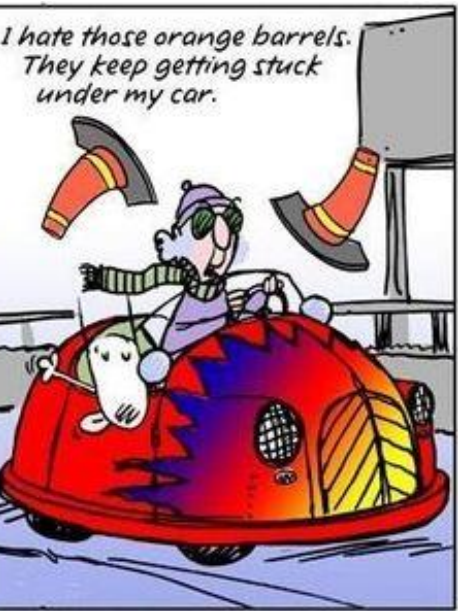

August is peak citrus season in more ways than one. While most citrus fruits are harvested in cooler months, their appeal hits full stride in late summer, when heat calls for bright flavors and cold drinks. Lemons, limes, oranges, and grapefruit show up everywhere this time of year—not just in produce bins, but in menus, recipes, and even a few quirky holidays. The science behind that appeal is simple: Citrus delivers acidity, aroma, and a quick hit of refreshment. A squeeze of lemon can sharpen iced tea, balance grilled foods, or lift a simple glass of water. Limes do the same for marinades and summer desserts, while oranges and grapefruit bring a mix of sweetness and bite that works well chilled. There's also a practical side to citrus in summer. Lemon and lime juices are widely used in food safety and preservation, from keeping sliced fruit from browning to adding acidity that helps control bacterial growth in certain dishes. August's food calendar leans into that versatility. National Creamsicle Day on August 14 highlights the long-running pairing of orange and vanilla, a combination that dates back to early 20th-century soda fountain culture. The next day, National Lemon Meringue Pie Day celebrates a dessert that balances tart citrus curd with sweet topping—a contrast that has kept it popular for generations. Later in the month, National Lemon Juice Day (August 29) and National Grapefruit Juice Day (August 31) shift the focus to drinks, where citrus continues to dominate. In a season defined by heat, citrus stands out for doing exactly what people want: cutting through it. Whether it's a cold glass of lemonade, a slice of pie, or a simple wedge on the rim of a glass, citrus continues to earn its place as one of summer's most reliable flavors.
